The Annual Parish Council meeting (as opposed to the Annual Parish Meeting reported on last month) took place on Wednesday 8th May 2024 at 7pm.

The Annual Parish Council meeting is a combination of the usual monthly meeting but also serves to re-elect councillors into the various roles and responsibilities for the next civic year i.e. 2024/2025.

Cllr Daley and Cllr Black were re-elected as Chair and Vice Chair respectively and the Declaration of Acceptance of Office was signed by both.


All councillors were elected to retain their responsibilities from the previous year.

News

D-Day 80th Anniversary Commemoration

In 2024 the UK will commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Normandy Landings on 6 June 1944 with a series of major commemorations and events across the UK and in France.

Known as D-Day, the historic operation saw the Allied Forces mount a large-scale invasion of Nazi-occupied France that ultimately tipped the course of the Second World War in the Allies' favour

Hartlip Parish Council has arranged its own village commemoration in collaboration with St Michaels & All Angels Church and the school.

Highways

Cllr Maleed presented the Speed Survey consultation results.

In addition to the numbers below there were lots of comments which we haven't shared here but it certainly shows that Lower Hartlip Road seems to be a problem and the most dangerous. Only today I noticed the multiple skid marks on the road surface particularly on the section from Paradise Barn Nursery to the Tuck Inn.

When HPC started these discussions with Kent Highways last year, a speed reduction on Lower Hartlip Road was rejected on the basis of non-compliance. Its interesting that The Street which is 20mph features high on speeding which is due to such non-compliance with the limit. Some residents say that no-one keeps to the 20mph limit on the Street, so reducing the limit on Lower Hartlip Road may not work.

It remains to be seen if things will improve once the Stockbury roundabout transformation fully opens at the end of 2024/beginning of 2025. Its probably more about driver behaviour, but HPC will continue to work with Kent Highways in an attempt to improve and make the lanes safer in the village for us all.

The next step is to present our data and comments to Kent Highways and we will update you once that meeting has taken place.

Finally, we are considering joining the Community Speedwatch scheme. The scheme is a national initiative where proactive members of local communities join with the support and supervision of their local police to record details of speeding vehicles using approved detection devices.

This will only work if we have enough volunteers so if you are interested in volunteering, please email the Parish Clerk.

Fly Tipping

Still no news on the covert cameras, you will see in the Police Hartlip Newsletter that our local Police Officer Jez Chittim continues on the case with the Environmental Response Team. He also details some of the patrols that have taken place in the usual fly tipping spots.

This isn't unique to Hartlip of course, Cllr Palmer reported at the May Parish Council meeting that fly tipping was a real problem across the borough. I have also seen the huge amounts of fly tipping around the Iwade area and have been made aware of mass illegal dumping on private land.

I don't think this is going to go away soon, but this continues to be a priority.

Police Surgery

Incidents of note

- On Friday 3rd May a Range Rover was stolen from an address in Mill Lane. This appears to be an isolated incident, however if there is any information anyone has about this matter, please call 101 and quote Kent police incident 03-0125. Should anyone have a keyless vehicle and is concerned about the safety of their vehicle, I can supply a signal blocker key pouch upon request; or see me at my next surgery.
- Fly t6ipping is still an issue I am trying to tackle; however the Environmental Response Team have informed me that they do require more reports on repeat locations. I have been conducting some plain clothes patrols in and around repeat spots and patrolled a couple of times in an unmarked police car. I have not caught anyone in the act of fly tipping; however I have started to visit any people who drive through the village at the time of my presence with commercial vans or trucks etc and likely to be carrying waste. I am doing this in the hope to prevent anyone believing it is appropriate to dump waste within Hartlip.



The Recreation Ground

The new signage to the Rec was installed. This proved to be good timing as it was reported on the Hartlip Residents Chat WhatsApp group that the 'No Dogs' sign to the playground area had gone missing, however a week or so later the new sign went missing. I have no words to write here about that.

The first set of improvements to the playground equipment will be made early summer, these will be mainly maintenance tasks in advance of the annual safety inspection in July.

The Rec working group will shortly be making their recommendation for the next phase of improvements following the public consultation and these will be shared as soon as we can.

The Parkland

HPC now has quotes in line with the improvement/repair specification put together by Cllr Rose. We will be looking to select and approve the preferred contactor ASAP so we can get on with the work.

Organising the annual spraying to the Parkland Paddocks is proving to be a difficult task when trying to coordinate the movement of the horses with their respective owners, the contractor carrying out work and then the weather! The clerk is pulling his hair out but as I write the weather is looking better and expect to pin the dates down very shortly.

Bin Collections

It's the beginning of May and the bin collections are finally getting sorted out but its recognised that there are still outlier's which have not been collected, Hartlip was hit hard and so too were the surrounding villages.

As we said last month thank you to Councillors Richard Palmer and Chris Palmer for keeping the pressure on SBC and if you still have issues please still email Chris Palmer ChrisPalmer@Swale.gov.uk so these can be logged and cleared up. It amazes me how some residents haven't had a bin collection missed!
